## **Chief Executive Office**

The Executive Committee held their monthly meeting last week via Zoom. Some of the topics discussed included FCC matters, assorted committee updates, and affiliated hamfest policies. Once the minutes have been reviewed and approved they will be posted to the website and shared with members.

All of ARRL's Section Managers across the country were invited to join David Minster, NA2AA, on Zoom meetings last week; most attended. The meetings were an opportunity for all SM's to communicate with David directly and to learn how the Field Organization restructure is being designed with Section Managers in mind. There were three separate calls in order to allow for more direct interaction.

Planning and preparations continue for the 2021 ARRL 2<sup>nd</sup> Board of Directors Meeting this July which will be fully in-person for the first time since January 2020. The full Agenda has been posted to the website and shared with members.

On a personal note, I'd like to share that I have submitted my resignation, effective July 9. I can honestly say that the staff at HQ are some of the nicest and most dedicated people I've ever worked with and I'm thankful for my time here. #### Field Services Mike Walters, W8ZY

Reorganization of the Field Services team has commenced with Mike Walters, W8ZY, starting on June 7<sup>th</sup> as the new Field Services Manager.

David Minster held three Zoom calls with the Section Managers on the evening of June 9 to introduce Mike Walters and Bob Naumann, W5OV, as new Headquarters Field Services staff leaders. A total of 61 of SMs and 18 Directors and Vice Directors attended. David outlined his vision for the Field Services team going forward and proposed a new project for volunteer Section Managers. A total of 14 SMs agreed to participate. (The calls were scheduled to accommodate different time zones across the country.)

David also introduced the Census Project. This is a plan for volunteer Section Managers to select a specific town with a working club and target licensed but inactive hams. The goal is to attempt to gather information on why they got licensed, what keeps them from being active now, and if there is a way to bring them back to being active. The local clubs will be used to facilitate direct contact with HQ staff working on mailings, emails and collateral materials.
