Education and learning Reported by Steve Goodgame, K5ATA

Steve Goodgame, K5ATA, travelled to Erie, Pennsylvania for an ARISS contact at Harbor Creek High School. The teacher at HCHS is a recent ARRL Teachers Institute graduate and has had twenty six of his students earn their amateur radio licenses. This contact was especially notable because the entire contact was run by students. Students assembled and installed antennas, installed and programmed the radios, and conducted the contact. The students were interviewed by the NBC Today Show host Harry Smith for a feature piece due to come out early 2024. ARRL Education staff as well as Joe Carcia, NJ1Q have supported the Harbor Creek students extensively over the past 18 months as they built their program. ARRL wrapped up seven days of deals this week, a series of seven holiday-themed emails that were distributed December 8-14 to members subscribed to receive publication announcements and special offers.

ARRL has implemented a new international shipping service with FedEx: FedEx International Connect Plus (FICP). Most of our standard international sales commerce will ship via the new service and will result in considerable savings for members/customers and ARRL.

With help from Alex Norstrom, KB1MOI, the December issue of *The Current*, featuring the January issue of *QST*, and the November/December issues of *On the Air*, *QEX*, and *NCJ*, was distributed to 91,390 members with subscriptions to the newsletter.

Jason Leonard finalized work to revise direct mail marketing materials for membership. Additional work is ongoing to revise emailed direct marketing materials, and to finalize revisions for new ham membership marketing. All of these materials reflect 2024 dues rates and related subscription fees.

When this fall's Section Manager nomination period concluded on December 8, Leona Adams, W1LGA, reported that Louisiana and Pacific Sections will have balloted elections this coming winter season. Members in the Pacific Section will vote for either incumbent SM Alan Maenchen, AD6E, or Kevin Bogan, AH6QO. Members in Louisiana will have a choice between incumbent SM Matt Anderson, KD5KNZ, and Houston Polson, N5YS. Leona will be preparing candidate statements and ballots for the local printer, and ballots are scheduled to be mailed out by January 2.
