After the solar eclipse on August 21, Section Leaders (including Emergency Coordinators) from the ARRL Sections that witnessed totality began to submit their Public Service Activity Reports and related summaries of Amateur Radio activities during this event.

Sales and Marketing

Yvette Vinci and Dan Wall attended the Huntsville Hamfest, the ARRL Alabama State Convention, August 19-20. Along with Director Greg Sarratt, they supported the ARRL booth throughout the convention. Also in attendance was Director David Norris and Alabama Section Manager JVann Martin. Dan gave a 1-hour LoTW forum and ARRL author Glen Popiel led the Arduino forum on Saturday. Yvette returned with 105 membership applications, including 13 new members and two Diamond Club renewals. Dues and subscriptions collected at the convention exceeded \$5,600 (\$4,628 in 2016). Thanks to Lisa Tardette in Business Services for making arrangements with R & L Electronics and Gigaparts to carry new ARRL publications at the hamfest.

On Wednesday, August 23, Yvette emailed a reminder to members with a summary of "What's trending" in the September issue *QST*, taking advantage of some early analytics shared by Allison McLellan. The notification was sent to 117,244 members.

Jackie coordinated a large mail campaign promoting advance sales of the 2018 *ARRL Handbook*. This mailing also features the special advance purchase bonus, offering a personalized ARRL member call sign badge with the purchase of a hardcover edition *Handbook*. The mailing is just beginning to reach mailboxes. The new edition *Handbook* begins shipping in October.

Jackie reported that we received a \$1,825 donation from the AmazonSmile Foundation for Q2/2017 program activity; YTD \$3,999; Y2016 \$6,699; Y2015 \$4,724; Y2014 \$1,913. The foundation donates 0.5% of the purchase price of eligible AmazonSmile items to ARRL—from purchases made by members and friends who have selected American Radio Relay League (ARRL) as their charity of choice.
