Amateur General Question Pool

The National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators (NCVEC) Question Pool Committee (QPC) has removed one General Class license question. The QPC of the NCVEC has deleted question G1E09 because they have determined the question is defective and must be withdrawn. They discovered that, as worded, the question is showing the wrong correct answer. Question G1E09 must be withdrawn from the pool effective immediately and should be removed from examinations as soon as possible. Updated question pool files, including the errata and new information, have been posted on the NCVEC General-class question pool web page. Additionally, this information will be posted to the ARRL website and will appear in the ARRL Letter.

Amateur Extra Question Pool and Examinations

The VEC department is already working to create the twelve new Extra exam booklets which must be used for Extra Class license exams starting on July 1, 2024. We will supply our officially appointed, field-stocked VE teams with new Extra Class exam booklet designs around mid-June.
