We have established an agreement with author Dr. David "Doc" Wescombe-Down, VK5BUG, to help introduce his new book to our US market. Doc is a well-known low band experimenter and operator. He has authored many books enjoyed by radio amateurs in Australia. His new book, *Low Bands Ham Radio: Special 2020 International Edition* is written especially for the English-speaking Northern Hemisphere. Rather than importing the books, which would have included a high printing and shipping expense, our arrangement allows ARRL to print copies in the US and then promote and sell the copies. Additionally, we will use a print-on-demand service to produce the books, keeping only a modest inventory based on current demand for the title.

We supported a VE team liaison for a local radio club in Carson City, Nevada seeking ideas and resources to help the exam team improve their engagement with new licensees. Bob Inderbitzen assembled and shared some best-practices he had picked-up from his contact with vibrant, active radio clubs. The volunteer was super pleased with the support which also included handouts to help promote membership.
