- Hudson Division Director: Ria Jairam, N2RJ (by 53 votes) and Vice Director William Hudzik, W2UDT (uncontested)
- New England Division Director: Fred Hopengarten, K1VR (by 49 votes) and Vice Director: Mike Raisbeck, K1TWF (uncontested)
- Northwestern Division Director: Mike Ritz, W7VO (by 281 votes) and Vice Director: Mark Tharp, KB7HDX (by 140 votes)
- Roanoke Division Director: Bud Hippisley, W2RU (by 526 votes) and Vice Director: Bill Morine, N2COP (by 237 votes)

Michelle Patnode, W3MVP was one of the ARRL HQ staffers assigned to sorting ballots in the ARRL Division elections on Friday, Nov. 16. David Isgur took photos of the election counting process that were posted to the ARRL's social media feeds. He also helped with distributing the election results to the ARRL News web page, as well as the ARRL Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn social media feeds.

David and Michelle met with Ed Hare, W1RFI, Bob Allison, WB1GCM, and Kris Bickell, K1BIC, to begin formulating plans to establish a "Lifelong Learning Lab" in celebration of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Hiram Percy Maxim. The goal is to create a permanent space within the Lab that would be used for filming informational and educational videos. Michelle is researching developing a list of recommendations for the audio, video and lighting equipment that would be needed.

The sub-committee is chaired by West Gulf Division Director Dr. David Woolweaver, K5RAV.


