Sales and Marketing

The 2019 edition of *The ARRL Handbook for Radio Communications*, available for the first time as a multi-volume set, was introduced to members in the digital edition of <u>September *QST*</u> on August 13. Orders for the limited edition six-volume boxed set can be placed with ARRL beginning Wednesday, September 5. The softcover format *Handbook* will also be offered. Yvette Vinci reports that the distribution list for the email notification for the September 2018 digital edition of *QST* included 117,578 members (116,669 in 2017).

Yvette reports that our team of Member Service Representatives handled 3,088 calls in July, versus 2,790 in July 2017. The team includes Margie Bourgoin, Jon Faasen, Liz Karpiej, Kim McNeill, and Cathy Stepina.

In July, we processed 22 paid-in-full Life Memberships and 14 Life Membership pledges.

Yvette Vinci prepared materials for, and attended, the Huntsville Hamfest -- this year's ARRL Southeastern Division Convention, held August 18-19. Along with Director Greg Sarratt and his spouse Sherry, KM4VSW, they supported the ARRL booth throughout the convention. Also in attendance was Director David Norris. Yvette returned with 131 membership applications including 36 new or previous members and one Diamond Club renewal; dues and subscriptions of \$7,349 (\$5,600 in 2017, and \$4,628 in 2016). Thanks to Lisa Tardette in Business Services for making arrangements with R & L Electronics and Gigaparts to carry new ARRL publications at the convention.

Jackie Ferreira reports that we received quarterly donations of \$1,868 (Q1) and \$1,895 (Q2) from the AmazonSmile Foundation for program activity during the first half of this year (Y2017 \$8,022; Y2016 \$6,699; Y2015 \$4,724; Y2014 \$1,913). The foundation donates 0.5% of the purchase price of eligible AmazonSmile items to ARRL—from purchases made by members and friends who have selected American Radio Relay League (ARRL) as their charity of choice. A couple of weeks ago, we reported on ARRL's first-ever exhibit at EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, held in July. There were 49 membership applications taken at the event – of which 34 were new members, and 11 were lapsed members. We also gathered call signs from nearly 500 attendees – impressive traffic to the our booth, and supporting further attention of the crossover between pilots and ham radio operators.

Jackie regularly supports Division-level conventions with targeted email promoting these events and ARRL's participation. She worked with convention committee members to send an announcement supporting the upcoming New England Division Convention, Boxboro, which will be held Sep 7-9.

Bob supported an ARRL author with a special recognition plaque to honor his contribution to ARRL publications surpassing 5,000 copies. The plaque will be presented by the author's wife as a Christmas gift.

Bob assembled materials to help support teacher John Hale, KD2LPM, and his students of Garden School Amateur Radio Club of Jackson Heights, NY with their exhibit at the upcoming World Maker Faire in New York City, to be held Sep 22-23. The exhibit is an annual joint venture of the Hall of Science Amateur Radio Club and Garden School ARC which use the opportunity to help demonstrate Amateur Radio at the Maker Faire. The event draws over 90,000 attendees.
