On January 17, we announced that ARRL is the new publisher of Gordon West, WB6NOA: https://www.arrl.org/news/arrl-is-new-publisher-of-gordon-west-wb6noa

We have taken delivery of the Gordon West books – the remaining inventory from the previous publisher. The books are quickly being shrink-wrapped with a printed piece that covers the back cover, indicating ARRL is the current publisher (including barcode, errata, and other ARRL resources). Thanks especially to Acquisitions Editor Mark Derks, KC1RVQ, for his contribution to this project. We have already started to receive orders for the books from dealers, which will be fulfilled this week.

Designs for covers are being completed for the new *Portable Operating Logbook*, a new printing of the Gordon West Technician Class book, and the new *Best of Arduino for Ham Radio* book.

Materials were prepared and shipped for our exhibit at Orlando HamCation, which will be held February 9 – 11. As part of our partnership with HamCation, Alex Norstrom, KC1RMO, readied the <u>ARRL Events</u> <u>App</u>, which attendees can use to navigate the 2024 exhibits and forums. Year-end reports were finalized for the Board meeting.

#### **ARRL Foundation**

#### Reported by Christina Lessard, KC1TDM

We have continued to field questions about the ARRL Foundation Scholarship Program from applicants and others. The 2024 scholarship application cycle closed on January 10. Two hundred applications from students were received, which is an increase of 45 applications from 2023. Staff utilized a function in Kaleidoscope (the software program used to manage the applications) for the first time to send emails and texts to students with applications in process urging them to complete their applications. The Scholarship Committee will review applications over the coming months and align deserving students with scholarships that are managed by the Foundation.

The Grant Committee recommended five proposals from the October grant cycle to be funded, which the Foundation Board approved. The following grants will be awarded and announced via ARRL News:

- The Montgomery Amateur Radio Club in Silver Spring, Maryland, will receive a grant for instructional materials for the first year of a Radio Merit Badge program during MARC/DECT Field Day so that 40 Boy Scouts can participate.
- The Yonkers Amateur Radio Club in Yonkers, New York, will receive a grant to purchase 10 handheld radios for training and instructional demonstrations, and ARRL publications such as an ARRL Handbook, ARRL Antenna Book, ARRL frequency charts, and an ARRL Field Resources Manual.
- The West After School Center, dba Afterschool Programs of Lancaster, Ohio, will receive support
  to hold a Wireless Technology and Family STEM Night in five different elementary schools.
  Activities include an interactive experience with a STEM trailer, building a paper circuit, and
  using a Morse code oscillator.
- The Augusta Preparatory Day School in Augusta, Georgia, will receive a grant to purchase additional parts for an AMSAT CubeSAT Sim.
- The Alabama School of Cyber Technology and Engineering in Huntsville, Alabama, will receive an award to purchase two complete sets of Foxhunting equipment.

# Reported by Joe Carcia, NJ1Q

Joe Carcia gave a Zoom presentation about W1AW to twenty-three members of the Metrocrest Amateur Radio Society.

W1AW received (and replied to) the first of monthly Winlink 2000 test messages sent from FEMA Region 1 as part of the overall collaboration between DHS, FEMA, and ARRL (W1AW). The WL2K messages are sent to both W1AW and its SHARES call sign (NCS310). One of the purposes of these monthly tests is to verify communications between W1AW and other served agencies. These test messages are sent to a number of radio operators in FEMA Region 1. Each message contains detailed instruction on how to reply.

Joe participated in a SHARES Working Group Zoom Meeting on Friday, January 26. The purpose of the meeting was to give updates to various SHARES stations – ARRL/W1AW is NCS310 – on current events within the program.

Joe participated, along with Steve Goodgame, John McAuliffe, KD2ZWN, and TI Instructor Wayne Greene, KB4DSF, in a Zoom meeting with John Kruk, N9UPC, of Yaesu. The meeting was to discuss the W1HQ Yaesu Fusion repeater, located in the ARRL Laboratory.

Joe assembled an exterior automatic tuner system for the 176' doublet antenna mounted on the satellite tower. This antenna will be used for SHARES/WL2K/MARS applications. Given the lack of (out of stock) readily available bias-tees (DC-blocks) to feed the external tuner, Joe designed and built two biastees to feed DC power to the tuner.
