ARRL has been notified of a bequest from the Estate of John Passaneau, W3JXP, (SK) formerly of State College, Pennsylvania. ARRL is a residual beneficiary and the approximate amount of this gift is \$160,000 (unrestricted).

The ARRL Foundation has approved a new scholarship fund, The K6GO Gayle Olson and NA6MB Mike Binder Scholarship. This scholarship will be endowed through a donation from Gayle Olson, K6GO, and Mike Binder, NA6MB, of Poway, California.

The ARRL Foundation has also approved a grant in the amount of \$3,000 to the Antique Wireless Association's (AWA) to fund AWA's Technology Explorers Radio Fab Lab – Level 1. AWA Technology Explorers are youth under the age of 20 who are interested in learning about wireless communication. The Radio Fab Lab consists of 12 monthly workshops with hands-on activities that include the basics of analog/digital electronics and communication. Participants build a receiver, oscillator/transmitter, antenna, and learn about digital communications. In partnership with the Rochester Amateur Radio Association, children are paired with an Elmer and encouraged to get their licenses, operating from the club station, W2AN.

The ARRL Foundation has hired Attorney Ed Spinella of Murtha Cullina, LLP to write a Letter of Opinion.

W1AW

We had another successful Field Day at W1AW. There were 1588 QSOs made, on 160 to 2 meters, including 6 satellite contacts, using CW, SSB and PSK31, for an initial claimed score of 1,622. The highlight of Field Day came Sunday when 10 meters burst wide open. Last year, 10 meters was pretty lackluster during Field Day. This year, 271 QSOs were made on FD Sunday. The pile-ups never ceased!

Also on FD Saturday, the station was visited by State Representative Gary Byron, whose district includes Newington. In addition, some young visitors from Hawaii caught a demonstration of Old Betsy, as well as some exposure to the on-air chaos that is Field Day. They were rather engaged and appeared to be quite interested.

Thanks to Joe Carcia, NJ1Q, Dan Henderson, N1ND, and Bart Jahnke, W9JJ for operating the station in the 2F category. Thanks to Michelle Patnode for taking pictures of the visitors to W1AW for use in social media posts.

Joe updated the web code practice files and their archives. He also updated the code practice file QST source web page Joe readied the station for Field Day. He also processed QSL card requests for some of the past special W1AW activations at ARRL hamfests and Division conventions.

Lab

QST Product Review

Bob Allison completed testing of a dual band FM mobile Analog FM/D-Star transceiver. The test data was compiled in the form of a data table and passed along to QST Product Review Editor, Mark Wilson, K1RO. Bob also tested a low noise power supply and then started a review of a single band handheld transceiver. He assisted with on-air testing of a solid state, AM transmitter and associated audio accessories with QST author, Joel Hallas, W1ZR. Many adjustments were made in order to maximize transmit audio quality. The equipment at Bob's end was the Johnson Valiant/National NC-303 combination, located at W1AW.

Radio Frequency Interference

Mike Gruber arranged a teleconference with representatives of a company that manufactures solar PV equipment to discuss the handling of RFI complaints involving their equipment. Present were Ed Hare, Bob Allison, Mike Gruber and QST author Tony Brock-Fisher. The solar company, located in Israel, had representatives from their legal and technical departments. The meeting concluded with the company agreeing to handle RFI complaints involving their equipment on a case-by-case basis.

Mike Gruber also chaired a meeting of the IEEE Working Group for p1897. This group, which includes ARRL Lab Manager, Ed Hare, W1RFI, is developing a recommended practice for the resolution of power line noise complaints. After the meeting, Mike began the editing and updates as agreed upon by the Working Group members.

Technical Information Service

Zack Lau, W1VT, uploaded the Propagation Forecasts for July. The predicted solar flux is just 75. Included in the many questions answered by the Lab's Technical Information Service were two TravelPlus phone calls—the first in months for a product that was discontinued last year. One caller wanted us to track down a possible database issue and the other wanted to know how to download TravelPlus to his Kenwood.

On a personal note, Zack Lau won Best of Show at the New England Rose Society annual event at the Tower Hill Botanical garden. His entry was a spray of Marilyn Monroe, an apricot hybrid tea rose. Growing roses is just one of Zack's many talents!

Volunteer Work, Historical Archives, ARRL Heritage Museum

Mike Marinaro, WN1M, ARRL archivist and historian, has made several new discoveries recently.

An extensive collection of snapshot prints of the HQ staff at work was discovered, taken in 1963-64 era, not long after completion of the present day ARRL Headquarters building (front half). There are also several building exterior shots and the surrounding property. The prints were originally in color but have faded to sepia. The album which will be scanned eventually is currently available for staff viewing in Bob Allison's office.

Another recent discovery made is of a unique scrapbook. The collection covers the lifetime of Amateur Radio experiences of Elizabeth (Liz/"Emzie") Zandonini (SK 1898-1989) 3CDQ/W3CDQ. Among her many distinctions Emzie was a fifty year ARRL member; an Assistant Director of the Atlantic Division and a prominent member of the YLRL. The album would be the substance of a great biographical article. The material is under study and any staff interested in viewing the album should contact Mike Marinaro by Email.
