David and Michelle joined other staff in attending the kick-off meeting with Mintz + Hoke officials for our collaboration. We will be providing them with analytics on our social media platforms.



Thank you to Steve Ewald, WV1X, and Dan Wall, W1ZFG, for covering the early morning shifts on Monday through Thursday for Joe Carcia, who was working the early afternoon/night shifts on these days for the vacationing Scott Gee.

Joe finished the construction and testing of the 16-channel passive audio distribution box. This unit will be used in the broadcast racks. He also assembled the second M-Square 6-meter loop antenna. This antenna will be part of a stacked-array for use with the 6-meter broadcast transmissions. Joe modified two PVC caps for use with the 6-meterr loop antennas. These caps will fit over the feed points of these antennas in an effort to keep rain – but mostly snow and ice - off the feed points. It has been observed that snow, ice, and occasionally, heavy rain, will adversely affect the tuning of the 6-meter loop antenna used for broadcasts. He also completed programming of a new set of ARISS frequencies that are to be programmed into the Yaesu FT-857D HF/V/UHF transceiver used for ARISS school contacts.

Scott processed one paper and ten electronic VUCC applications for a total of 862 credits.
