ARRL Foundation

Public Relations and Outreach

The Emergency Management Department has been busy updating the ARRL EmComm training materials and working with the Education and Learning Department to get the Basic EmComm Course and the Intermediate EmComm Course up and loaded in the Learning Center. The Basic Course is active, and we have already had several people complete the course. The Intermediate Course will be active very soon. We are in the process of updating documentation on the website to reflect the new courses.

VEC

FCC Electronic Batch Filing System – The FCC electronic batch filing system (EBF) was not accessible from Thursday evening, April 4, to Wednesday, April 10. This system is used by all VEC organizations for filing exam sessions, individual applications, and club license applications. During the outage, applications for new and upgraded licenses, as well as individual and club license filings were not being accepted into their system for issuance. The EBF system was available again on Thursday, April 11. ARRL VEC staff transmitted hundreds of backlogged sessions and application files into the FCC EBF system on the 11th without any issues.

Amateur Extra Question Pool and Examinations – The VEC department finished creating twelve new Extra exam booklets and answer keys which must be used for Extra-class license examinations starting on July 1, 2024. The booklet and answer key PDFs will be sent to the printer within the next few weeks and the printed material must be returned to us by the beginning of June. We will supply our officially appointed, field-stocked VE teams with new Extra-class exam booklet designs around mid-June. The new 2024-2028 Extra-Class Question Pool, which is available on the NCVEC website, is effective from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2028.
