Status of Active FCC Proceedings Related to Amateur Radio as of May 10, 2010

ET Docket No. 10-98

Title: In the Matter of Amendment of Parts 2 and 97 of the Commission's Rules to Facilitate Use by the Amateur Radio Service of the Allocation at 5 MHz

Status: Notice of Proposed Rule Making Released May 7, 2010, not yet published in Federal Register

Comment Date: Unknown (30 days after publication in Federal Register)

Reply Comment Date: Unknown (45 days after publication in Federal Register)

Summary: Based on an ARRL petition (RM-11353) the FCC proposes to substitute a new 5-MHz channel for one that is usually not available for amateur use, to increase the power limit to 100 watts ERP, and to permit CW, PSK31 and PACTOR-III operation with provisions to ensure that harmful interference to Federal stations is avoided.

ARRL position: The ARRL supports the proposals that are consistent with its petition. ARRL positions must be developed with regard to time limits for transmissions, possible additional emission types, VOX operation, encouraging ALE capability, and whether narrowband emissions such as CW and PSK31 must be limited only to the center frequency of each channel. *References:* http://hraunfoss.fcc.gov/edocs_public/attachmatch/FCC-10-76A1.pdf (NPRM)

Title: In the Matter of Amendment of Part 97 of the Commission's Rules Regarding Amateur Radio Service Communications During Government Disaster Drills

Status: Notice of Proposed Rule Making Released March 24, 2010

Comment Date: May 24, 2010

Reply Comment Date: June 7, 2010

Summary: The FCC proposes to amend §97.113(a)(3) to permit a control station operator to "participate on behalf of an employer in a government-sponsored emergency preparedness or disaster readiness test or drill, limited to the duration and scope of such test or drill, and operational testing immediately prior to such test or drill." The FCC also seeks comment on whether employee operation during non-government-sponsored emergency communications drills should be permitted.

ARRL position: ARRL supports a rules change to permit an amateur station licensee or control operator, on behalf of an employer, to "participate in emergency preparedness and disaster drills that include amateur operations for the purpose of emergency response, disaster relief or the testing and maintenance of equipment used for that purpose." Such participation would not be limited to government-sponsored drills.

Title: In the Matter of Amendment of the Amateur Service Rules to Facilitate Use of Spread Spectrum Communications Technologies

Status: Notice of Proposed Rule Making and Order Released March 16, 2010, not yet published in Federal Register

Comment Date: Unknown (30 days after publication in Federal Register)

Reply Comment Date: Unknown (45 days after publication in Federal Register)

Summary: In response to an ARRL petition (RM-11325) filed in April 2006 the FCC proposes to eliminate the automatic power control (APC) requirement for spread spectrum (SS) emissions with a transmitter power output exceeding 1 watt, but to reduce the power limit for SS emissions from 100 watts to 10 watts. In the Order the FCC corrects certain oversights, including an inadvertent 2006 reduction in the power limit for Technician licensees.

ARRL position: To be determined (i.e., is the reduction in the power limit an acceptable tradeoff for the elimination of APC?)

Title: In the Matter of Amendment of the Amateur Service Rules Governing Vanity and Club Station Call Signs

Status: Notice of Proposed Rule Making released November 24, 2009; comment deadline passed *Comment Date:* March 26, 2010

Reply Comment Date: April 12, 2010

Summary: The FCC proposes to incorporate several policies related to vanity and club station call sign issuance into its rules, and to limit clubs to one club station license.

WP Docket No. 08-63

Title: In the Matter of ReconRobotics, Inc. Request for Waiver of Part 90 of the Commission's Rules

Status: FCC granted the waiver request, with conditions, by Order on February 23, 2010. ARRL has filed a petition for reconsideration.

Summary: In January 2008 ReconRobotics sought a waiver to permit the licensing by public safety entities of a remotely controlled surveillance product that operates in the 430-448 MHz frequency range. ARRL opposed the grant of the waiver on several grounds, including the potential for harmful interference to the Amateur Radio Service. The FCC nevertheless granted the waiver request with conditions intended mainly to protect the primary federal government users from interference. ARRL continues to oppose the waiver and has filed a petition for reconsideration. ReconRobotics has filed in opposition to reconsideration, but assenting to ARRL's position with respect to labeling and notification in the device's instruction manual.
